

Curriculum Beyond the Classroom

Subject	How else can I support my child?
Maths	<p>Check they have all relevant equipment (including a protractor and scientific calculator)</p> <p>Ensure they complete homework on time and to the best of their ability (due on Tuesdays)</p> <p>Signpost them to speak to their teacher if they need extra support with a topic</p> <p>Prior to termly assessments, encourage students to utilise the revision lists which are shared with students on Google Classroom</p> <p>Encourage students to use their analysis sheets after they have their assessments returned to them. These guide students in identifying areas for development and signpost them to relevant Hegarty Maths clips</p> <p>Encourage regular use of Hegarty Maths MemRi and FixUp5 tasks (under tasks button)</p> <p>Revision guides are available for purchase on Parent Pay for KS4 students</p>
English	<p>Check in on their homework on google classroom and ensure they complete on time</p> <p>Encourage them to develop a love of reading – regular library visits and asking them about what they are reading all help.</p> <p>Encourage them to read regularly and widely- including current affairs and the news</p> <p>If possible take them to the theatre.</p>

	<p>For GCSE pupils:</p> <p>Purchase CGP revision guides from school - contact the Heads of English at the school if there are any financial constraints with this as we can support.</p> <p>Support them with revision of their key texts at GCSE by discussing the resources available to them on google classroom and the dedicated school website for GCSE prep.</p>
Science	<p>Making flashcards for areas they find difficult</p> <p>Helping to mark exam questions at home</p> <p>Helping them complete questions under timed conditions</p> <p>Monitor their seneca learning</p>
Creative Arts	<p>Take them to see shows, gigs, productions live or stream them at home.</p> <p>Visit galleries and museums and read a variety of art articles, plays and books to improve literacy skills.</p> <p>Practise drawing skills as much as possible making sure that observation, tone and shading are used.</p> <p>Listen to the radio and music over different genres and time periods, if possible encourage your child to play an instrument and practise drawing skills at home.</p>

	<p>Ask your child to teach you how to read music, and get them to try theory quizzes on the internet to make it more engaging.</p> <p>At KS4 ensure at least two extra hours of artwork is done outside of lesson time in line with the project theme.</p> <p>At KS4 ensure Music practice is completed daily and time is spent on compositions.</p> <p>For KS4 Music practice exam questions at home.</p> <p>NCFE Music technology, check Google classroom to check assignments.</p>
MFL	<p>Testing your child on weekly vocabulary.</p> <p>Encouraging them to complete their homework.</p> <p>Checking Google Classroom for homework set and catching up lessons.</p> <p>At KS4 – ensuring they attend interventions.</p>
PE	<p>Be healthy and active with your child every week. The recommended amount of physical activity is 30 minutes 5 times per week</p> <p>Join a local sports club with your child. A full list can be seen outside the sports hall on our clubs noticeboard</p> <p>Buy the two books listed above if your child studies GCSE PE</p> <p>Encourage your child to join an extracurricular sports club. Our Extra Curricular timetable is on the school website. Your child can also access it from their form tutor and it is on the wall outside the sports hall and on the doors to the changing rooms.</p>

Design Technology	Support them with their coursework (NEA) in KS4. This is an ongoing piece of work that should be worked on whenever possible.
Humanities	<p>Ensure that they complete homework on time and to the best of their ability</p> <p>Check their understanding of the key aspects of knowledge from their different units. Retrieval knowledge questions are available in their booklets for KS3 to aid quizzing them. Revision countdown booklets are used at KS4.</p> <p>Encourage discussion with them about recent/ current events to help support their understanding of the world and enflame their curiosity.</p> <p>Take them to visit local places of interests e.g. Epping Forest, Stratford, museums, galleries etc.. linked to different Humanities subjects to further their knowledge and interest.</p> <p>Explore a range of wider reading book topics on the various subjects we cover in humanities that they may be interested in to encourage independence, curiosity and knowledge.</p>
Computer Science	<p>Getting your child to weekly practice their programming skills at home</p> <p>Encouraging them to complete their homework</p> <p>Checking Google Classroom for homework set and catching up lessons</p>
