Numerical Grade	GCSE subjects are assessed on a scale of 1-9, with 9 being the highest grade. Targets are based on KS2 data.
Getting Ready	Pupil is working towards a Grade 1.

Z	Not yet able to assess

Engagement in Learning	
Outstanding	Always demonstrates a positive attitude towards learning and engages fully with all learning activities (inc. homework).
Secure	Usually demonstrates a positive attitude towards learning and engages with most learning activities (inc. homework).
Requires Improvement	Can demonstrate a positive attitude towards learning and engage with learning activities (inc. homework) but requires some prompts from staff to reach their potential.
Cause for Concern	Rarely engages positively with learning activities (inc. homework) and requires continual re-focus from staff to prevent disruption.

Your Child's Report

Is a snapshot of engagement and achievement at the end of last term

Here it identifies:

- attendance
- positive outcomes in lessons and around school
- negative outcomes during the school day
- The rest of the report focuses on progress, performance in mock exams, targets and engagement with learning in their subjects

Attainment by Individual Subject

- Progress is identified across subjects individually
- The indicator of positive progress is the colour green - the darker the more pupil is working above the target.
- Can you tell me why their teacher assessment is yellow?
