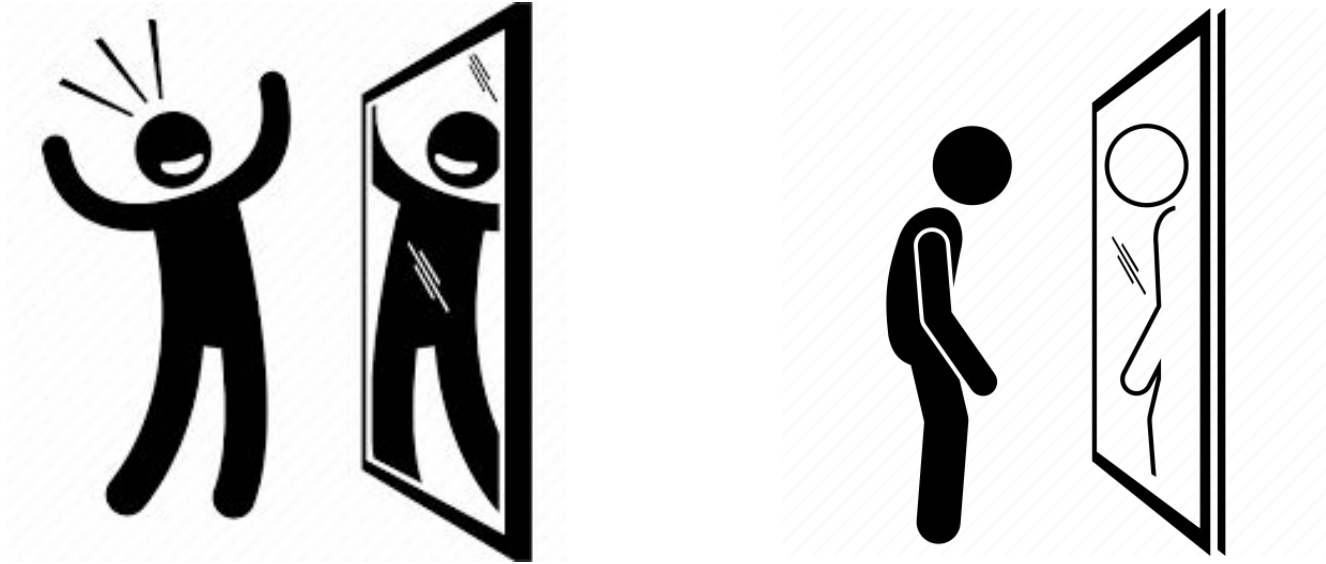

7 students have improved by more than a grade per subject on average since the last set of mocks

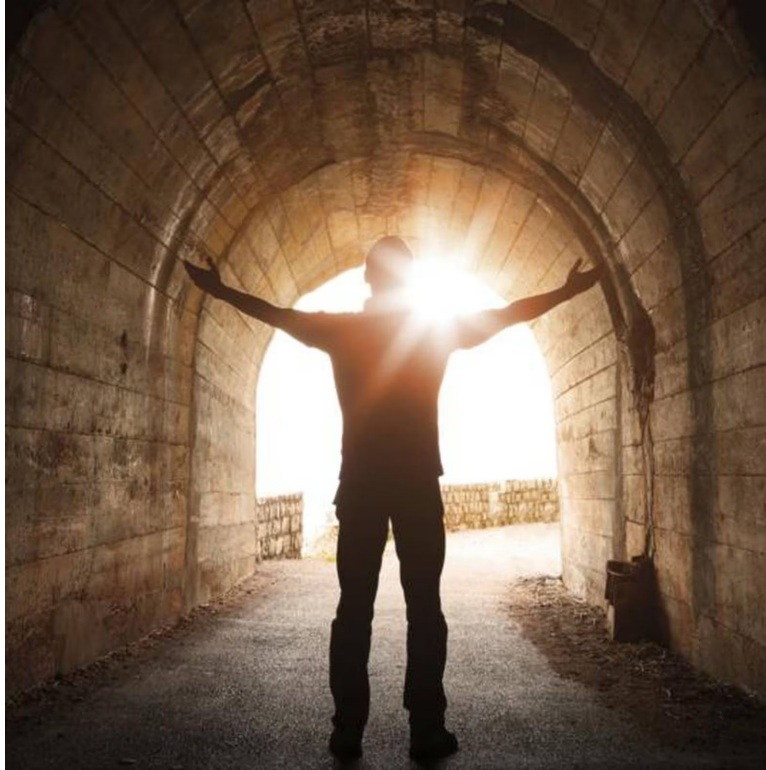

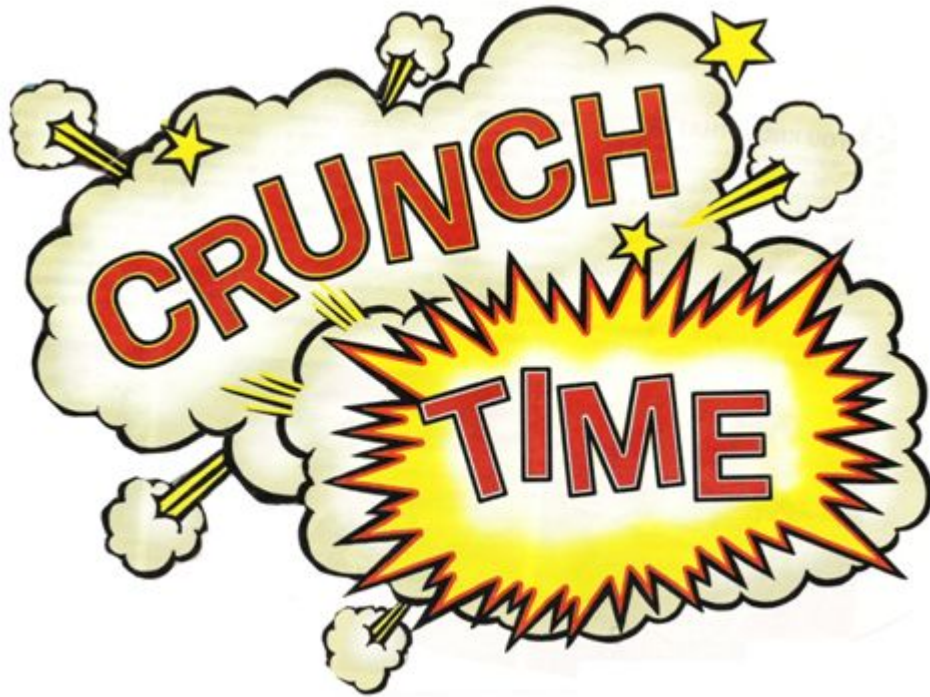

Why is school attendance so important and what are the risks of missing a day?

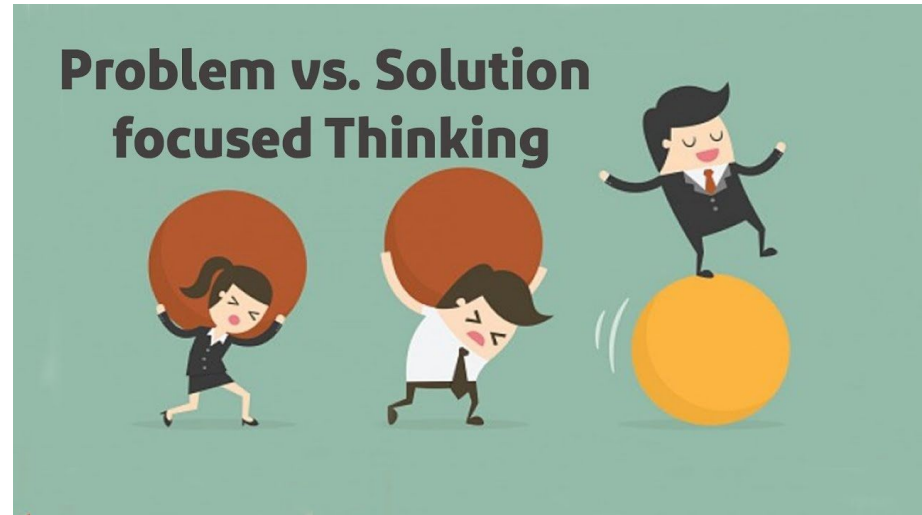

Similarly, in the same year, secondary school pupils who didn't achieve grade 9 to 4 in English and maths missed on 10 more days on average over the key stage than those who achieved grade 9 to 5 in both English and maths.

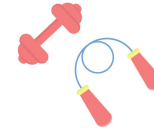

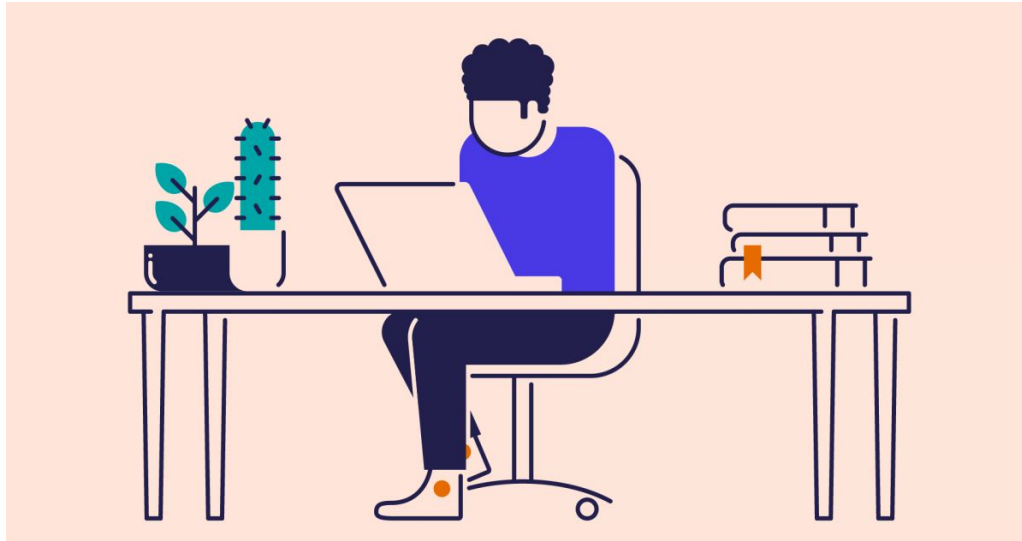

- Work hard- at school and at home - your future self will thank you if you use this last stretch of time wisely



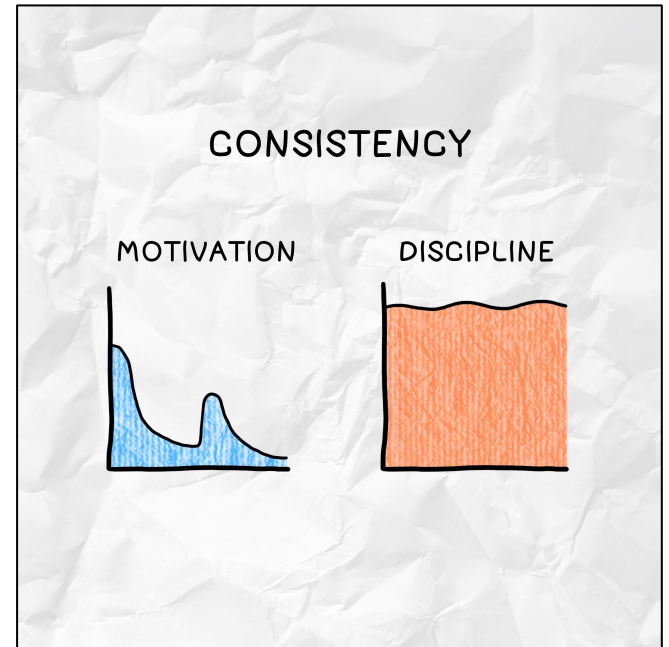

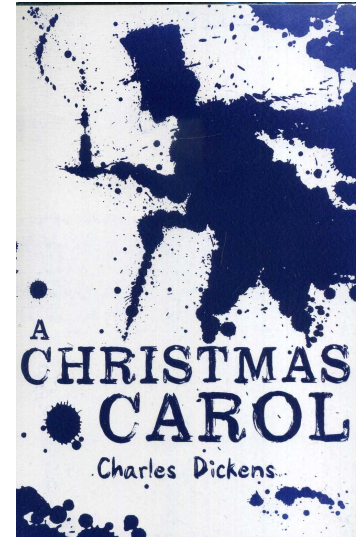

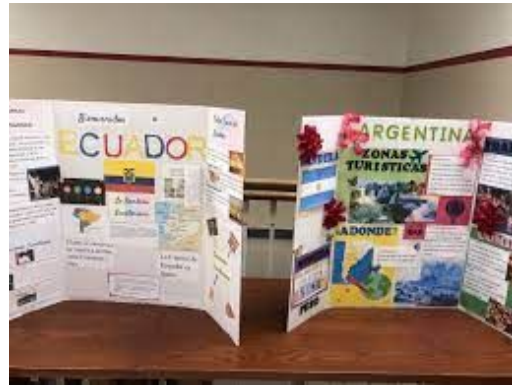
Cultural Dress/Wear your colours

Y11 Prom


The date has now been set for this and the Prom will take place on the evening of Thursday 20th of June.

The event will be at school to maximise the safety and affordability of this event for all.


Tickets are on sale from this evening- you are welcome to purchase them in the Street area after this presentation and they will be on sale until the 3rd of June.
